

When should one apply for a Copyright Licence?

When one is considering reproduction of published work that exceeds the ambit of 'Fair Dealing' or the Exceptions in Section 13 (Regulations) of the Copyright Act, one would be required to apply for a copyright licence.

Permission is required for the following means of dissemination that includes copyright material:

- student handouts, course pack or study guides with a compilation of extracts of articles from published source eg. Books, journals or internet sites;
- Blackboard, Moodle, or any other e-learning platform;
- Short Loan collection or reserved material;

Distribution of published material via any medium to students eg. email, flash drives, CDs or DVDs is not permitted without an licence.

NB.

Prior to applying for copyright permission please check whether the material is available within the Library existing stock or the e-resource collection on the Library website. One should only provide a link by placing the title and URL on the selected method of dissemination.

One requires permission for inclusion in theses, dissertation, journal articles, books, etc. by making application directly to the rights owners eg. author or publisher.
